4. SPECIAL MEETING WORKSHOP ITEM

A. Receive Rate Analysis and Presentation

General Manager Nicholas Schneider introduced Sanjay Guar of Water Resource Economics who presented the draft water and wastewater rates from the Water and Wastewater Cost of Service Analysis.

Board feedback on the treated and raw water portion of the presentation.

Board discussion examined the reliability factor utilized in the rate determinations, the impacts on the Auburn Lake Trails customers, the wastewater reserves, and the impacts on the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), rate application options, and available timeframes. The Directors provided input to the presentation, including the need to emphasize that if the District experiences financial default, a State takeover would be a possibility. Should the State take control then Proposition 218 protections would no longer apply. The State would set rates without ratepayer, or stakeholder input. The District's endeavors in grant funding procurement to assist with needs and rate stabilization were reviewed.
