




16.865 mg / 544,032 average mgd 29 – Alarms Stator Replacement Replaced Overflow Lines

Summary of Field Work Activities

Outside of normal operations functions, distribution crews focused on system wide valve survey to meet 2021/2022 Capital Improvement Plan goals, responded to numerous USAs in connection to utility storm response, updated security lighting at the main office yard, locating/digging out blow-off valves and vault repair.



Water Supply

January 31, 2022 – Stumpy Meadows at 108% of average

Department of Water Resources complete Monthly snow survey on February 1, 2022. Using the data collected and in combination with the Aerial Remote Sensing of Snow Program it was determined Central Sierra Nevada snowpack is 89% of average in February.

Between period of December 28 and January 26 Delta was in excess and Folsom Lake was making American River Excess Releases. District calculations show a refill credit of approximately 500 acre feet during the period. Monthly reports are submitted to Department of Water Resources and Bureau of Reclamation for verification.




