

ORDINANCE 83-2

An Ordinance Amending Article 2 - General Provisions, Sec. 2.9. Penalty for Violation; Article 10 - Discontinuance of Service, Sec. 10-3. Reconnection Charge; and Adding under Article 9 - Billing, Sec. 9.9. New Accounts - Rentals; and Adding to Article 10 - Discontinuance of Service, Sec. 10-9. Returned Check Charge; and Sec. 10-10. Field Collection Charge; to ORDINANCE 82-1, An Ordinance Establishing Rates, Rules and Regulations for Water Service By and Within the Georgetown Divide Public Utility District

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Directors of the Georgetown Divide Public Utility District, El Dorado County, State of California, as follows:

1. That the Ordinance 82-1, An Ordinance Establishing Rates, Rules and Regulations For Water Service By and Within the GDPUD and Repealing Ordinance Nos. 77-10, 79-1, and 81-1 Relating to such Rates, Rules and Regulations, adopted by said Board on the 14th day of April, 1982, be amended as follows:

ARTICLE 2 - GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 2.9. Penalty for Violation. For the failure of the customer to comply with all or any part of this Ordinance, and any ordinance, resolution, or order fixing rates and charges of this District, a penalty for which has not hereafter been specifically fixed, the customer's service shall be discontinued and the water shall not be supplied such customer until he shall have complied with the rule or regulation, rate or charge which he has violated, or in the event that he cannot comply with said rule or regulation, until he shall have satisfied the District that in the future, he will comply with all the rules and regulations established by ordinance of the District and with all rates and charges of this District. In addition thereto, he shall pay the District the sum of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25) for renewal of his service.

ARTICLE 10 - DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE

Sec. 10-3. Reconnection Charge. A reconnection charge of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) plus penalties as provided in Sec. 11-1 will be made and collected prior to renewing service following a discontinuance for violation of District rules and or regulations.

2. That the Ordinance 82-1, An Ordinance Establishing Rates, Rules and Regulations for Water Service By and Within the Georgetown Divide Public Utility District and Repealing Ordinance Nos. 77-10, 79-1, and 81-1 Relating to Such Rates, Rules and Regulations, adopted by said Board on the 14th day of April, 1982, be further amended by adding the following:

ARTICLE 9 - BILLING

Sec. 9.9. New Accounts (Rentals). That the new accounts shall be established in the name of the owner and tenant, with a joint water application, signed by both parties. The terms of the application shall require the owner to be responsible for all of the charges for the premises occupied by the tenant, with all charges billed to the owner. However, the tenant may pay and the District may receive these charges. If the owner cancels his request for water service, and requests the water turned off at a leased premises, the District shall NOT disconnect the water service so long as all charges are current, unless the tenant vacates the premises, or the owner furnishes the District with a judgment in unlawful detainer by a court of competent jurisdiction, ordering the tenant to vacate the premises, or unless the tenant otherwise consents.

In the event of absentee owners, the District will accept an agent, executor, or realtor agent, with presentation of a signed and acknowledged document from the owner stating the person is an "authorized agent" to handle the necessary transactions involved in renting the property.

Sec. 9-10. Returned Check Charge. In the event a check is returned from the maker's bank, marked "insufficient funds", or for whatever reason is returned, the customer's account will be charged a Ten Dollar (\$10) Returned Check Charge.

Sec. 10-10. Field Collection Fee. If an account is delinquent, and is scheduled for turn-off, the field personnel may accept payment in the field to avoid discontinuance of service. The customer will be charged a Ten Dollar (\$10) Field Collection Fee to accept this payment.


3. Upon adoption, this Ordinance shall be posted in three (3) public places at least seven (7) days prior to the expiration of thirty (30) days from the date of its passage, and shall be published in the Georgetown Gazette and Town Crier, a newspaper of general circulation published in the District, one (1) time at least seven (7) days prior to thirty (30) days from the date of its adoption and shall be effective thirty (30) days after adoption of this Ordinance.


