2) ADOPTION OF AGENDA

3) PUBLIC FORUM (ONLY ITEMS THAT ARE NOT ON THE AGENDA)

Mr. Tony Franco spoke about Georgetown Creek drying up. He requested information about the gunniting of the creek. He referred to the GDPUD mission statement, specifically number three, which states promotes stewardship to protect community resources, public health and quality of life. He said at the last meeting, he made note of the exemption that was given to be able to gunnite the ditch. He said there was an exemption for the environmental impact review. He said the reasons that GDPUD gave for the exemption was a categorical exemption code C1-15301. He said the reasons given for exemption were that the project was repair and maintenance, minor alteration of existing public water facility that will not expand the current use of the raw water delivery system. Project activity would not be expected to contribute to significant cumulative impact to the environment, nor are there unusual circumstances that would lead to a significant impact on the environment and does not involve a state scenic highway. He is requesting to see the environmental reporting information prior to the next meeting. He said he wants to see where the project has no impact on the environment aside from the gunning of the ditch. He wants to know what agency signed off on the project to give

GDPUD the exemption to gunnite the ditch. He said whether it be Fish and Wildlife, or the Water Board or Water the Resources Control Board. He said he provided reports showing that the Georgetown Creek relies on the seepage or leakage of the ditch to survive. The creek is now 100% dead. Poverty Creek is trickling. He said Poverty Creek does have fish in it, and they are alive. Poverty Creek does rely on Georgetown Creek. He said once the ditch is lined above Poverty Creek, there will be another environmental impact, which he says is in direct opposition to GDPUD's mission statement. He said he was requesting the documents to see how that exemption was granted and what work went into it to say there was not going to be an environmental impact.

Mr. Stephen Dowd said he was at Stumpy Meadows. He said he saw a boat leaking gas, and he said the water was up to the spillway.

6) INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

A. Board Reports

Director Saunders reported out on the water use meetings he attends. He also discussed the ACWA conference, and grant opportunities he would continue to work on with Adam.

Director Garcia commented on water conservation that Director Saunders commented on. She asked if there was a difference between land that had cattle, and not had cattle. Director Saunders said he brought up that issue, as well as levels of rainfall. She also mentioned the ACWA conference and requested the Board to have the General Manger to get together with Mr. Franco regarding the questions he posed during public comment.

Director Wadle said he sent out information from CSDA on behalf of the District to get some assistance. He said the State budget included \$50M in grants for agencies to deal with PSPS impacts, and OES is developing the guidelines for the grant. He said locally, the El Dorado County Water Agency Board which he sits on, has a meeting tomorrow, and has an approval of grant cost-shares where the District would be a recipient. He said there was \$49,750 which is being proposed to help with the meter replacement project, the water system reliability program, and for the urban water management plan. He thinks the funds will be approved by the Board.
