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COVID-19 RISK MINIMIZATION DISTRICT IS NO LONGER ACCEPTING CASH PAYMENTS

On March 17, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom issued Executive Order N-29-20, which follows the March 4 declaration of a State of Emergency in California as a result of the threat of COVID-19.

The Georgetown Divide Public Utility District is adhering to recommendations from the United States Department of Homeland Security, CDC, and OSHA. The National Infrastructure Protection Risk Plan framework suggests guidelines related to protections for the public and CA State essential employees.

Until further notice, the District office will no longer accept cash payments. The District accepts payments via U.S. Mail (check or money order, only) and through our website (www.gd-pud.org) via credit card, digital check, or other electronic means. Customers can also call the District office to pay via credit card over the telephone. Please be aware when paying via credit card on the District website or over the phone, there is a third party convenience fee from the credit card processing company.
